PARTICIPANT FORM

Players are expected to adhere to the following rules for participation in interscholastic athletics:

1. Show appreciation and support for all fellow team members.
2. Attend all practices and games. Unexcused absences from practice will result in less or no playing time during the interscholastic game.
3. Show respect for fellow team members, members of competing teams, all officials, and all others present at an interscholastic athletic event.
4. Avoid actions or words which are inappropriate for Christian young men or young women, such as inappropriate displays of anger, demeaning words or belittling comments made to players, officials, or others present at the athletic event, profane or abusive outbursts, kicking of benches, sassy behavior, fighting or brawling with other players.
5. Dress appropriately for games and practices, (in accordance with school dress guidelines).
6. Memorize plays and drills, etc. just as if they were in a classroom setting.
7. Behave in locker rooms and make sure that the room is left clean and neat after every practice or game.
8. Be in school the entire day of the interscholastic activity or the entire day before if the athletic activity is on a weekend in order to participate in the athletic event.

Probation

During a season, a student may become ineligible due to unsatisfactory academic achievement and/or failure to attain a "C" average and have no "F"s in any subject. During the sporting season, teachers/coaches will check the academic progress of team members with faculty members every week. Parents of students with unsatisfactory reports will be notified immediately. Parents may be asked to meet with the staff to determine if sports participation is presenting an obstacle to academic success. If the decision is made that this is the case, the student will be placed on probation at that time. The following procedure will then apply:

1. The probation period will begin the day following the staff meeting where the decision was made to place the student on probation.
2. During the first week probation period, the student will be allowed to attend practices, but he/she will not be allowed to participate in games.
3. If there is no academic progress evident at the end of the first week probation period, the student will not be allowed to attend practices or participate in games. Depending upon the length of the sport season, the student may or may not be eligible to be reinstated, based on his/her academic progress, after another one-week probation period.
4. If a student becomes ineligible for interscholastic activities, due to disciplinary reasons, the following procedure will be followed.
 - Upon the notification of parent(s), any student on disciplinary probation will not be allowed to participate for a period of one week. Re-admission of the student will be done at the consensus of the faculty members and administration.
5. If a situation occurs and does not fall under any of the above circumstances, it will be evaluated by a committee made up of faculty members, the Athletic Director and the Education Administrator. This committee will determine final action in consultation with the student's parent(s).

The Interscholastic Athletic policy has been approved by the Board of Trustees. In addition, there may be other rules or guidelines developed by the coaches and approved by the Board of Trustees.

I have read the Interscholastic Athletic Policy and the rules or guidelines that the coach has issued. I agree to abide by this policy and these rules and regulations to the best of my ability.

I will cooperate fully with the coaches and all persons and organizations concerned to promote Crown Point Christian School's Interscholastic Athletic Policy.

At all times, whether at school or away from school, I will conduct myself in a manner that best promotes the Interscholastic Athletic Policy of Crown Point Christian School.
